

# \$1.5M settles crash lawsuit

A Great Kills man has accepted \$1.5 million to end his Brooklyn Supreme Court trial in connection with a 1993 automobile accident that left him with multiple injuries.

The plaintiff, Brian Gloster, 21, was injured in an accident on Richmond and Nome avenues in New Springville Jan. 10, 1993.

Gloster was a passenger in a vehicle driven by Gregory Schwab, which collided with a vehicle operated by Ali Bakri.

Schwab and Bakri were named as defendants in the action.

The plaintiff's attorney, John G. O'Leary and McMahon, alleged in court papers that the accident occurred because the Bakri vehicle was speeding.

Gloster suffered a fractured nose and an injury to his left knee that required surgery, court papers show.

Defendant Schwab was represented by the Manhattan law firm of Pazer and Epstein. The Manhattan firm of Isserlis & Sullivan was counsel to defendant Bakri.
